


In 1715 [The Benedictines](#) became Chaplains to the Molyneux family at Woolton Hall. And in 1731 The ‘Woolton Mission’ was founded at St. Benet’s Priory in Watergate Lane.

In 1859 The Foundation Stone of our present Church was laid and dedicated to the patronage of Saint Benet, it wasn’t until two years later that the church was renamed Saint Mary’s. The Benedictines remained in the Parish until 1873.

Saint Benedict and his sister St Scholastica can be found in several places around our church, reminding

us of our Benedictine heritage. They are depicted in the stained glass window behind the main Altar. You will have also walked passed them as they are carved into stone either side of the main door. And there are statues on the side Altar.
